history and physical examination appropriate investigations are ordered blood tests urine analysis imaging studies X rays ultrasounds CT scans MRI and specialized tests depending on the suspected diagnosis 4 Formulation of Differential Diagnoses This involves listing all possible diagnoses that could explain the patient's presentation

should be prioritized based on likelihood and severity

Once a diagnosis or the most likely diagnosis is established appropriate treatment is initiated and regular followup is scheduled to monitor progress and address any complications
